Doors open for exhibitors at 7:30 a.m. Friday and Saturday. This is a two-day show. Exhibitors must be ready at 8 a.m. and remain open during all show hours until 5:00 p.m. Saturday. Check-In at EOWA table for booth assignment and packet. Tables will be in place Thursday. Security is provided and locked overnight; storage is provided. Tables must be covered on top and all 4 sides to the floor (sheets not permitted).

FRIDAY NIGHT SHOW DINNER

Dinner is 6:00 p.m., Friday, July 13, at the Union School 8th Grade Center, Cost is \$11.50 per person. The dinner will be catered by Escargot and consist of meat, vegetables, bread, dessert and drink.

APPLICATIONS

THIS IS A WOODCARVING, WOODTURNING, WOODWORKING, PYROGRAPHY, SCROLLSAW, AND INTARSIA SHOW. Entries should be received no later than Friday, June 22, 2007. Late entries will be accepted based on cancellations. **Exhibitors must sign Agreement on Application Form.**

NON-COMMERCIAL EXHIBITS MUST BE AT LEAST 80 PERCENT WOOD-RELATED, WITH THE REMAINING 20 PERCENT RELATED TO SUPPLY ITEMS. NO BRONZE, STONE, OR MOLDED CARVINGS MAY BE SHOWN OR SOLD.

The Show Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any application and/or display and is the final authority on all show policies. First-time Show applicants are requested to submit pictures representative of their work with their application.

SEMINAR SCHEDULE

EOWA will sponsor instructional seminars Friday and Saturday Schedule to be announced.

JUDGING

Open Category Judging begins at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, July 13; Novice Category immediately follows. Judging is by teams that are trained and assigned. Competition is open only to exhibitors present at the show. Awards will be presented immediately following.

Voting for Exhibitors Choice is Friday, 12:00 noon to 1:00 p.m. with entries limited to blue ribbon winners.

Each exhibitor will be allowed one entry for People's Choice (any piece winning People's Choice in a previous EOWA show is not eligible to be entered). Instructions for Peoples Choice voting and exhibiting will be included in the exhibitor packets. People's Choice award voting opens 1:00 p.m. Friday and closes Saturday, 12:00 noon. Award presentation at 12:30 p.m.

A.B. SMITH MEMORIAL CARVING CONTEST

A carving contest, open to exhibitors only, will be held on Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. Contestants are limited to one knife blade, one pencil, and one sharpening device. A blank, the subject of which remains secret until contest time, is furnished at no charge. Judging and Awards will be made at the close of the contest.

PURCHASE AWARDS

Show Exhibitors may present two entries for each price category on Saturday at 1:00 p.m.

EOWA is soliciting purchase awards and expects to total around \$1,000 by show time. Committed purchase awards for last year's show totaled \$1,000.

SALES

Sales are permitted. Sales tax is the responsibility of exhibitors possessing an Oklahoma Sales Tax Permit (submit your permit number with entry form). If you do not possess an Oklahoma tax permit, you will be required to submit a tax report to the EOWA with the collected tax at the end of the show. EOWA will provide the form and instructions in your exhibitor packet.

DOOR PRIZES

EOWA draws for door prizes for visitors hourly. If you would like to contribute a door prize please bring it to the EOWA club table. The club encourages a donation of a small carved, turned or sawn item, small rough-out or other wood-related item. Thank you.

2007 JUDGING CATEGORIES

Each exhibitor is limited to one (1) entry per category. Additional credit may be given for originality. Any item winning a BLUE ribbon in any previous EOWA Show is not eligible. Category must have a minimum of two pieces entered to be judged. All decisions by the judging committee are final

WOODCARVING

Relief High - Any subject, any finish (includes pierced relief).

Low - Any subject, any finish (no piercing or undercutting).

Chip Carving (excludes fragmentation, appliqué, high, low, and pierced relief).

Flat – any subject, any finish

Three-Dimensional – any subject, any finish

Gouge – any subject, any finish

Carousel & Mythical Figures: Any type, single or group any finish.

Carved Walking Stick & Canes: Any type of walking stick and cane will be in this category, any finish.

Carved Footwear: any type, any finish.

Realistic

Human Bust – single, any finish.

Human Full Figure – single, any finish.

Marine Life – single, any finish

Birds: Bird of Prey, single any finish

Songbird, single, any finish

Game Bird, single, any finish

Waterfowl, single, any finish

Animal - single, natural finish

Animal - single, painted finish

Group Same Subject - any finish

Group Mixed - two or more species, any finish

Floral - any finish

Artistic or Stylized

Wildlife – single or group, natural finish, grain must show.

Human – single or group, natural finish, grain must show

Abstract – natural finish, grain must show

Caricature

Human – single, any finish

Wildlife, Animal, Bird or Marine Life – single, any finish

Group Mixed – two or more species, any finish

Group Same Subject - any finish

Driftwood, Bark or Log Carving - any subject, any finish.

Miniature - must not exceed 2" x 2" x 2", any finish

Religious - any subject, any finish (excludes entries in Holiday Category).

Holiday – any finish (Valentine's, Easter, 4th of July, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, etc.)

Pyrography – non-carved item, any subject, any finish.

Whittled/Traditional – items carved from a single piece of wood with one blade, no power tools, no assembling, any finish (i.e. chains, ball-in-cage, 1"x1"x4", traditional folk patterns, etc.)

Instructor assisted/Seminar Carving – carvings created with extensive help from an instructor (i.e. using an instructor's blank, and/or carving on the piece by the instructor).

Miscellaneous – orphaned items from categories with insufficient entries.

Decorative Functional – any subject, any finish with a specific function or use carved in (love spoons, neckerchief slides, salt & pepper shakers, bottle stoppers).

Novice – one who has never won more than 3 blue ribbons in the Novice Category or 1 blue in an EOWA Open Competition.

Realistic – single or group, any finish.

Stylized – single or group, any finish.

Caricature – single or group, any finish.

Relief – high or low, any finish.

Chip Carvings & Walking Stick/Cane – any finish.

WOODTURNING

Spindle Turnings – lamp base, candlesticks, turned between centers, turned furniture parts, letter openers, pens and pencils, lace bobbins, mallets, etc.

Bowls – face plate or chuck turned items with wide mouth; salad bowls, nut or fruit bowls, to include plates and platters.

Hollow Vessels – face plate of chuck turned items with a small opening (vases or urns).

Turned Boxes with Lids – jewelry, pill, mushroom boxes, etc., with sculptured profiles, boxes w/legs.

Woodturnings w/Fancy Decorations – any woodturning with fancy decoration, such as carving, inlay, intarsia, coloration, segmentation, lacing, piercing, attached cords, feathers, glass beads, etc.

Any Other Turned Object – any turned piece that cannot be reasonably placed within one of the preceding categories.

WOODWORKING

Seating – objects made for sitting (chairs, rockers, benches).

Tables – a top supported by a base (legs, pedestal), such as a desk, an end, coffee, dining, game, and drafting tables.

Chest/Cabinet – objects that are freestanding made for storage, display; may be totally or partially enclosed, such as display cabinets, chest of drawers, cedar chests, book shelves, entertainment center, glass-enclosed shelves.

Wall Mounted – shelves/cabinet shelves and cabinets mounted on the wall; may be open or closed (book shelf, display cabinets).

Toys and Games – any adult or children's toy or game; trucks, trains, boomerangs.

Children's Furniture – all furniture built for a child (tables, chairs, beds, chests, toy chests, art easels).

Any Other Functional Piece – objects that do not fit in any other category, such as cutting board, serving cart, decorative wall hanging; objects made to display by hanging on a wall; plaques, picture frames, decorative shelves.

Decorative Boxes – boxes with or without lids, can be any size but not including turned boxes; band saw boxes, jewelry boxes, music boxes, chip carved boxes, inlaid boxes, laminated boxes.

Any Other Decorative Item – objects that do not fit in any other category.

SCROLL SAW

Intarsia – pictures made by cutting and shaping different kinds of wood.

Decorative Functional – items made to be decorative and provide a useful function, such as clocks and boxes.

Wall Hangings – items cut to provide a scene or saying (excludes shelves).

Ornaments – items cut as ornaments, such as fan pulls, Christmas ornaments, etc.

Three-Dimensional Items – items cut and assembled to provide a decorative piece, but does not have a function other than decorative.

Toys – items for play
